A motion to set Garage Sale Day on April 24, 2010 and hold city wide clean up days on April 30th and May 1st from 7 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. was made by Simmons with a second by Jebsen. All ayes.

A motion to change the May meeting date to May 11, 2010 at 6:00 p.m. at the Delmar Fire Station was made by Simmons with a second by Jebsen. All ayes.

During **reports** Ruchotzke informed the council that several streets need repaired this year.

Mayor Hardin discussed the need to make sure that citizens that are not mowing their lawn in a timely manner be warned early this year and fined if not in compliance. Hardin stated that it is not fair to those that keep their lawns trimmed for others to get by without mowing theirs.

Hardin discussed several verbal complaints she has received regarding junk and junk vehicles. When formal signed complaints are on file at City Hall the City can move forward with resolving the issues.
