

**Delmar City Council Proceedings
SEPTEMBER 8th, 2021**

A motion to accept Peggy Sellnau's resignation was made by Simmons with a second by Frett. All ayes. Loras Frost was present at the meeting to discuss the city storm drain that is on his property. He would like to city to pay half for cement and putting a grate on top of it, for safety issues.

A motion was made to pay half of the cost, up to \$1100.00 by Gerlach with a second by McDermott. All ayes.

Reports:

Terry Behn reported that city water shut-off valves need to be installed as soon as possible. Steve Jebsen will follow up on this.

Daryl reported that the road has been patched in several areas and cleaned by the via dock. Mayor Hardin asked if the weeds could be sprayed on the school street, which Daryl will see to.

Gerlach brought to the council's attention that the park lawn needs to be trimmed and asked Daryl to see to it as well. Frett mentioned that he has had several compliments on the downtown. He also inquired about getting lamp posts installed.

Jebsen had a complaint about cars parked on the basketball court for the car show. This will be brought up to the Delmar Lions.
