A motion to approve cashing the sewer savings CD for \$43,517.31 and adding \$56,482.69 to the balance, creating a \$100,000.00 balance and purchasing a new CD for a term of 5 years at 2.30 interest was made by Goodall with a second by Eberhart. All ayes.

A motion to cash CD #48719 at Maquoketa State Bank for \$5,679.20 was made by Goodall with a second by Eberhart. All ayes.

Bruce Floyd, Jake Brake complaint – signs prohibiting the use of Jake brakes in the city limits will be posted as soon as possible. Ganzer was instructed to send a letter to the company specifically named in the complaint and a letter to Mr. Floyd explaining the procedures that will need to be followed to file a complaint with the Clinton County Sheriff's Office when he witnesses a violation.
